From the Pastor...

The last six years have involved a few things that they never talked about or taught me in seminary. Almost thirty years ago, email was just catching on, and I received my first computer (a Mac Classic hardwired to a dot matrix printer) as a graduation gift from college (thanks, Mom & Dad!). That computer helped me get a master's degree, but now it is in the closet. It stays in there because it can't keep up with technological advances of the internet and software programs. In many ways, society grows more complex, and there aren't many signs of simplicity. This means that to simplify, one needs to make intentional, often counter-cultural choices.

If you would have looked at me in the eye when I was in seminary and told me that someday I would be living in North Idaho through a global pandemic, serving a church while preaching to an empty sanctuary for months while using a cell phone camera to connect with Facebook Live, I would not have had any frame of reference to what that would involve. The pandemic has pushed many people into very significant changes, along with the mental and emotional strains of navigating steep learning curves of the unknown. It has also brought out trends that were hidden, such as institutional decline, fragmentation of society, and political polarization.

Genesis opens with creation narratives, and after six days of labor, God rests on the seventh. Sabbath reflects this divine rest after a time of prolonged effort. May 2, 2023 is the start of a three-month

rest from regular patterns and responsibilities. Special focus involves reading through Jean Gebser's book, *The Ever-Present Origin* (feel free to read along this summer if you get a copy), daily journaling to emphasize the discipline of writing, and three "inspirational author tours" that include Idaho, Washington, Oregon, California, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maryland, and Pennsylvania, especially related to Sigurd Olson and Henry David Thoreau. We will also see old friends and visit relatives along the way.

The first step is often the most crucial and sets the tone for what follows. Our first step involves planting a tree. The approved Presbyterian Board of Pensions Sabbath Support grant of 5,000 dollars includes the purchase of a Fuji Apple Tree. Shawna and I will plant this in our yard (I call our property Honey Frame Place) and it will grow to share blossoms with future beehives. We then travel to the Redwoods of northern California and walk among ancient groves. This will invite awareness, root us in the grounding Presence of God as the living Christ is celebrated. A great way to begin the Sabbath journey, like a call to worship for a pilgrimage!

Blessings on your summer, and I hope you find ways to simplify, stay grounded in Presence, and enjoy the beauty of the Earth as more than tourists, but as participants, pilgrims on a spiritual journey to learn lessons of experience that only active rest can teach.

Recommended Outdoor Services:

- · No Sandpoint City Beach service.
- · Conduct Simple Services (June 25, July 30) outdoors in the Peace Garden. Include Fellowship with outdoor services: June 25 ice cream social; July 30 potluck brunch.

Sabbatical updates - Pastor Andy gave a brief itinerary of his upcoming sabbatical It was decided to discontinue being a Collection sight for Jerry Kingery's Bible foundation Finance Report: March income \$9,299, Expenses \$14,064. 1st Qtr summary Income \$35,000, Expenses \$36,659.

Pastor's Report - Board of Pensions assistance grant received was upped from \$4,000 to \$5,000. Cell phone vouchers were approved for reimbursement during Sabbatical time (\$50.22 per month, as budgeted). Pastor Andy performed the funeral on April 5th, 2023 for Leslie Linnendoll (passed away March 18th, 2023).

Judy Labrie provided the following game plan for sabbatical logistics.

Between vacation time and sabbatical, Pastor Andy will be away from **April 25 - August 15 (or 16).** 

**Pastor's email** - Pastor Andy's email is on Vacation Mode with an announcement that no one will be checking his email while he is away. emails are not accepted at all.

**Pastor's Phone** - The friends and members of the church will refrain from calling or texting Pastor Andy while he is away on vacation /sabbatical. Unless there is an emergency at which time call and leave a voice mail message.

**Church telephone messages** - Ramona catches the phone messages on Wednesday mornings. Otherwise, someone should check messages on Sunday mornings and Tuesdays. Perhaps get the code for remote access to phone messages.

USPS Mailbox - Susie and Ramona check the mail.

**Bulletins for Worship -** should be in to Ramona by Wednesday mornings so she can put words to the songs in the bulletin and record the License Agreement. Sue Helander tidies the pews and sanctuary. Ramona prints the bulletin for the Worship Assistant with yellow highlights and puts it in the Pastor's mailbox for Sunday.

# **Session Meetings -**

The Book of Order states the session should meet at least quarterly. Pastor Andy will be available to moderate all the session meetings:

In the meantime, session can do business via emails adding the outcomes to the September consent agenda so the issues can be recorded. If a special session meeting with a moderator must be held, the topic must be limited to the issue of concern.

Leadership huddles - If Elders and Deacons want to brainstorm topics without formal meeting minutes, Leadership huddles can be held and topic recorded via September consent agenda.

#### **Building Uses - Cleaning**

The building is normally cleaned on Ken's personal schedule. He cleans once a week before Sunday Worship. He's paid for 1 / week cleaning; anything else is extra.

For events, he will clean before each use so the church is ready and does the normal cleaning afterward for the church.

The church calendar in the office has a green asterisk next to the event to let Ken know that he needs to clean before it. Ramona reminds Ken when he should clean for an event. Ken is not always in town to see when the building is being used and he needs to be told about events.

# **Sanctuary Thermostats -**

Pastor Andy will set both thermostats in the sanctuary on the best schedule for summer. If the temperature needs to be adjusted, do this:

Change the temperature by using the Arrow Up or Arrow Down to the setting desired then press the HOLD Temp button

Change back to the preset schedule by pressing the Run Program or Run Schedule button

## **Budget Notes**

Total revenue received in March lagged the estimated monthly income while year-to-date income remains ahead of the anticipated budget.

Expenses in March exceeded the estimated monthly budget; however, the additional expense can be attributed to several annual mission related gifts.

\$530.00 was disbursed from the Christmas Joy Special offering

\$500.00 was donated to the "Building Towards Reconciliation" campaign for repair of the churches of the Nimiipuu

The annual per capita assessment of \$39.00 per member for a total of \$2730.00 was paid in March. Year to date, FPC members and friends have donated \$1,367.00 to offset this expense.

An additional gift of \$600.00 was sent to the Synod/Presbytery and an additional \$250.00 was gifted to the General Assembly.

### **First Quarter Notes**

FPC ended the first quarter with an expense/revenue shortfall of \$1659.00. This is mostly a deficit related to several larger annual expenses occurring in the first quarter.

At the end of the first quarter, FPC has a combined checking and savings account balance of \$105,536. This is an anticipated decrease of about \$5000 from 2022 as the accumulated pastor study leave funds from prior years have now been expended.


