From the Pastor...

People often ask me how things are going as a part-time pastor, and specifically, "how are the bees?" Mid-April, I once again become a beekeeper after having taken a year off. I've ordered two "packages" of bees, each about three pounds and consisting of around 5,000 European Honeybees of the Carniolan variety, plus a mated Queen for each group. The subspecies Apis mellifera carnica (the Latin name) originates from the Carnica subregion of Slovenia. Because they are now part of the beekeeping scene in North America, the actual bees I get are trucked up from California.

There is a process for installing them into the hive boxes of my Bee House (A-Z Hives from Slovenia). The packages (see photo of past arrivals) keep the Queen separate from the colony. They need time to accept her as their Queen, which is usually a couple of days. After that, she is released from her protective cage and she searches for wax cells to lay eggs, up to 1,500 per day. Life in the hive is very busy!

Beekeeping has many aspects and there is always more to learn. It has taken me many years to get to the point of a hobby beekeeper with a bee house. I still don't feel like I know exactly what I'm doing, which is humbling and helps keeps an open mind to learn more. It is (mostly) enjoyable, though I don't like getting stung, once or twice a year on average. I always look forward to harvesting fresh, raw honey that flows with golden wonderment. Slovenian hives make a premium grade that is

delicious.

I also enjoy writing about the spirituality of bee keeping, among other topics. More recently I've started a Substack site to post my writing online. There is a Substack website and an app to access my profile and read the material, with the option to support that work through a subscription.

It's only been about a month, but almost 50 people have signed up to receive a subscription, most of them free but some paid, and there have been almost a thousand views so far. This is a great place to post my sermons each week as Spiritual Reflections. There is also a Poetry section, and soon, a Spirituality of Beekeeping page.

Like most things, writing on Substack involves a learning curve. It also takes courage to put one's thoughts, feelings, and spiritual discoveries into public realms on the internet. But I'm continually amazed at how the words resonate with people, and their comments and emails to me indicate how helpful the writing is at key points in their life.

So, I will continue to practice beekeeping, and practice writing. Both involve moments of anxiety, not knowing how things will go, and opportunities for meditation as I relax into the amazement of it all. Life happens in that mix, so maybe in small ways we can help change the world for the better.

Session Summary

The March meeting of the Session occurred on March 19, 2024, with Pastor Andy moderating. In attendance were Sharon Anderson, Sue Helander, Sylvia Humes, Judy McComish, Judy Labrie, Mary Sturgis, Paula Vincent, and Kirsten Thompson.

Kirsten Thompson was appointed to serve as Stated Clerk of the session. The minutes from the January 16 and February 20 meetings were approved.

Mary Sturgis agreed to take the lead on getting Easter lilies and spring flowers to decorate the sanctuary for Easter. Thank you, Mary!

Session discussed the current webpage and Facebook access. The livestream on Facebook goes through Pastor Andy's personal Facebook page which can cause technical issues. Some updates to both services will be investigated, and an effort to move livestream from Facebook to YouTube will be considered. Some members of the congregation find it difficult to hear in the sanctuary, and assistive listening devices might be helpful. Kirsten Thompson and Sue Helander will follow up on these issues.

Pastor Andy will be on vacation April 1-7. The Session approved a simple service for April 7. Sharon Anderson and the Adult Sunday School Group will lead the service, and Dana Stockman will lead a hymn sing. Pastor Andy reported that Communion would be observed on March 31st, Easter, instead of April 7, facilitating the simple service format. Many thanks to Sharon and Dana for helping lead worship while Pastor Andy enjoys a well-deserved Sunday off.

The Highway cleanup day is scheduled for May 2024. Volunteers will meet at 10 a.m. at the Westmond store/gas station. Expect more details to come about this event.

Judy Labrie reported that the St. Patrick's Day Dinner held on March 15, 2024, in which First Presbyterian partnered with the Sandpoint Area Senior, Inc. was a great success. The traditional Irish dinner of corned beef, cabbage, and rolls served 82 diners with leftovers to spare. After deduction of expenses, the church and senior center each raised \$1,208.88 from a combination of donations for dinner, raffle ticket sale, and the lively auction of special desserts. Special music and entertainment rounded out a fun evening. There were many volunteers from SASI and the church who made this event very special indeed.

Session discussed and approved the additional use of the church facility for an AA group that had previously met at the Gardenia Center. AA groups pay a donation fee for use of the facility.

The church wedding policy was reviewed and updated to reflect more current costs and the time impacts on Pastor Andy's work with a half-time pastoral schedule. The session approved the use of the church for couple who is planning their wedding for January 2025, and has requested that Pastor Andy officiate at the church.

Paula Vincent reported that 2024 expenses and income are tracking as expected. Per capita and other expenses come out in March. Paula reported that two CD's have now been rolled over so as to maximize interest at this time, and the Session discussed some ideas about recruitment for a person to fill this position when it becomes vacant.

The session decided to move their regular monthly meetings to the third Wednesday of each month at 1:30 p.m. The next session meeting will be Wednesday April 17, 2024, at 1:30 p.m.

Pastor Andy closed the meeting with prayer.
